Same Mission, New Name



The 2024 ERCKWA program calendar was incredibly busy, with 16 programs run throughout the year. Thousands of volunteer hours went into planning, delivering and reflecting on the camps, and creating the wonderful ERCKWA memories for and with our kids and families.

140 participant referrals were accepted in 2024 from 165 applications. 319 program places were taken up by participants across programs held in the metropolitan area.

Our End of Year Family Fun Fest was a highlight for our families and a huge success. The event was held at Telethon Community Cinemas (TCC) Murdoch and was sponsored by TCC. The event saw the families enjoy activities such as a dunk tank, inflatable basketball ring, arts and crafts, and sports.

Presents and gift vouchers were generously provided by Aquinas College for the kids and their families to enjoy. The families were invited to stay and enjoy a free screening after the event. However, due to inclement weather, the screening did not go ahead.





OUR VOLUNTEERS

Our camp programs were facilitated by 310 ERCKWA volunteers. This includes the management team members, catering and driving volunteers and our fabulous leaders. Over the year, 120 young adults were trained to attend and help facilitate ERCKWA programs.

There were four non-program volunteer events throughout the year, including the post-January camp celebration and awards ceremony; a pre-July camps catchup and fundraiser at Grill'd Applecross; post-July celebration; and end of year event.

The Volunteer Leader Committee (VLC) was incredibly active in 2024. The VLC hosted two Bunnings sausage sizzles; spearheaded a fundraising partnership with Yo-chi; supported a City of South Perth Containers for Change cleanup event and ran resource clean-up days at the ERCKWA Headquarters and main camp venues.

Due to his exceptional dedication to ERCKWA, his initiative as a volunteer leader, coach, VLC member, and support around the office, Mitch Crook was again awarded the 2024 Volunteer Leader of the Year. Mitch has been an outstanding member of the Thriive team and leaves us to travel America in 2025.



FINANCIAL REPORT

FINANCIAL STANDING

2024 saw ERCKWA successfully return to a surplus as strategic execution and financial diligence were paramount. With a net surplus recorded for the period (\$8,808 in 2024), we strengthened our financial foundation while continuing to deliver impactful programs to both remote and metropolitan communities.

This reflects ERCKWA's commitment to prudent financial management, operational efficiency, and steps towards income diversification. We are well-positioned to enhance our long-term sustainability and expand our outreach efforts.

INCOME SOURCES

ERCKWA again extends our sincere gratitude to our sponsors, donors, supporters, and leaders whose contributions have been instrumental in our success. Our established relationships and ability to foster strong partnerships has enabled us to increase income levels in 2024 (\$452,357 in 2024 and \$359,591 in 2023).

Grant funding revenues returned to historic levels (\$280,335 in 2024 and \$256,843 in 2023) and ERCKWA extends our gratitude to Telethon, Lotterywest, and the Edmund Rice Foundation for their continued support.

COST MANAGEMENT

ERCKWA remains committed to delivering life-changing experiences in a cost-effective and sustainable manner. Despite the external environment, we successfully implemented cost-saving initiatives without compromising program quality or accessibility (total expenses reduced from \$461,176 in 2023 to \$450,772 in 2024).

Employee expenditure remained the largest cost component (\$256,214 in 2024), reflecting a commitment to retaining and supporting our valued team. The Board has played a crucial role in securing the organisation's financial stability and provided a foundation for ongoing developments.

We look forward to building on this momentum in the years ahead, ensuring our mission continues to positively impact children, leaders, volunteers, and staff for generations to come.
