COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT MANAGER'S REPORT • BY MELISSA RAICH

Our Programs

The 2022 ERCKWA programs calendar was incredibly busy, with 17 programs run throughout the year. Thousands of volunteer hours went into planning, delivering and reflecting on the camps, and the wonderful Eddie Rice memories created for and with the kids and families.

111 participant referrals were accepted in 2022, with 301 program places attended across programs held for referred participants. These camp programs were facilitated by 354 volunteer leaders and management teams (total volunteer places across all camps attended), with 44 ancillary volunteers helping to cook and drive across our Mega Camps and Mini Camps.

The standout program of 2022 was the newly redeveloped Remote Communities Program (RCP; formerly Eddie on the Road) which travelled to the Pilbara, supported by a Lotterywest grant. Five volunteers and I flew to Newman and we then travelled by car almost 2,500kms throughout the region. We ran 1-, 2- and 3-day programs in Strelley Community; Warralong Community; and Jigalong Community respectively, whilst also visiting the communities of Nullagine, Marble Bar and Pardoo with the program participants on excursions. Upwards of 210 children participated.

Profile, Fundraising and Events Manager Nicole Mancini later joined us to facilitate the formation and leadership training portion of the program, held in the beautiful Karijini National Park.

TREASURER'S REPORT • BY AARON DOMINISH

Financial Standing

During 2022, the global economy continued to place the coronavirus pandemic in the rear-view mirror. ERCKWA was the beneficiary of incredible generosity during the financial year and this support, along with a measured approach to operations, has resulted in a net surplus of \$6,823.

The organisation returned to a calendar of sustainable camp programs and continued to implement alternative initiatives that bring genuine smiles to those in our community.

Income Sources

ERCKWA extends our sincere gratitude for support received from all sponsors, donors, supporters and leaders. Our organisation delivers tremendous joy thanks to the incredible generosity of our valued stakeholders and supporters.

We strengthened relationships with a variety of supporters, which has ensured that income is continually sustainable (from \$500,311 in 2021 to \$422,666 in 2022).

Prudent Cost Control

Considering the uncertain economic conditions, ERCKWA sought to squeeze value out of each and every dollar received to provide happiness. Overall expenditures decreased by \$42,626, with a significant focus on reducing motor vehicle expenditures.

Employee expenditure continues to represent the largest cost item (from \$247,757 in 2021 to \$231,796 in 2022), with the organisation maintaining four permanent staff members at year's end. We are pleased to assist in the continual growth of our team and their ongoing success.

The Board is continuing to actively monitor the financial position and performance of the organisation as the Australian economy continues its recovery.

Outlook

ERCKWA continually monitors our financial position and performance, whilst maintaining an environment with strong governance principles, stakeholder relationships and prudent cost controls. We are excited to continue championing a world of youth education and happiness.
