## **Grant Applications**

Edmund Rice Camps is committed to securing funds from various sources and we are indebted to the **Christian Brother Province** and **Edmund Rice Foundation Australia** (ERFA) for their past and ongoing grant funding support. We have submitted applications for support in 2018 and look forward to hearing the outcome of those submissions in November. In addition we currently await the outcome of applications that have been made to **Aurizon** and **St George Bank**. The grants from Aurizon and St George Bank are for the funding of the Eddie on the Road programme and its expansion to cater for growing demand. The total amount of grant funding applied for is \$153,000. Fingers crossed!
