
## **Our Eddie Rice Network and Programs**


EOTRSW was an incredible experience as we learnt how versatile our program had to be and how adaptable the planned activities. The children on the program were very keen to run about and had high energy levels, this meant we incorporated more sporting activities with the game 'Farmer Sam' a major highlight for everyone.

The EOTRSW experience had a strong focus on personal development and leader growth. Mornings incorporated team work and learning more about both each other and ourselves, with loads of planned activities for the evening. Activities included morning yoga sessions, bonding exercises and most importantly our hype song, Roar by Katy Perry.

The Eddie Rice spirit was also a strong part of what we did on the road. Having limited time with the children meant that we had to be fully engaged and present during our increased time together. We created many activities that made sure we found out fun facts about every child, adapting the program to fit everyone's needs and most importantly ending each day with a big Eddie Rice thank you and chant.

The community involvement was very strong throughout EOTRSW. With help from our sponsors at Landcorp we were able to have more time interacting with the children as we had many helping hands on board. The local support was also incredible and we received assistance with cooking, equipment (the Waroona Council loaned us their BBQ) and some local staff even got involved with the activities. We even managed to recruit one of the local council workers for ERC as she loved the program so much and could see the difference we made in a few hours.

"During September I was fortunate enough to be able to travel to Queensland to attend the Muddy Boots formation experience at the Mt Archer Earth Community. The 4 days I spent there were some of the most peaceful and enjoyable days that I've experienced within my recent memory.



Run by Peter Hay and Br Geoff Whitefield with support from Br Tony Hempenstall and Br Peter Harney from the Mt Archer Community the program involved time to look inwards within ourselves, outwards towards our natural environment and our communities. I was fortunate enough to be surrounded by 5 other amazing individuals who also work in other Ministries within the wider Christian Brothers network, and having the opportunity to engage with and learn about ourselves while surrounded by such good company certainly made the experience extra enjoyable.

We learnt about the natural environment which surrounded the Mt Archer Community, including the different flora that was native to the area or had been planted by the Brothers and other members of the Mt Archer Earth Community. Not far from Mt Archer was the Glasshouse Mountain Ranges which we got to learn about, the stories of the Glasshouse Mountains and the significance landforms have to the indigenous people. We were encouraged to make the connection between ourselves and the earth on which we walk, live and exist upon. And finally we learnt some of the history of the Christian Brothers and about how Edmund Ignatius Rice was such a unique individual. Specifically, his morals and values which made him so inspirational for so many, including the Camps Ministries that continue to operate across Australia and engage with so many young individuals. Learning about his character and building my knowledge of his achievements was very inspiring and certainly reinvigorated my own passion for Edmund Rice Camps WA and Christian Brothers Ministries.

#### Service Learning - Year Six

Congratulations to all students in Year Six who completed a very successful Service activity and managed to raise \$1255.00! What an achievement!

Here are a few words from our Year Six students about the day:

"Designing and working as a team was very successful to raise money. We had to build and set up our stalls to give each Junior School boy a great time with their mates and playing fun games. Over the course of 4 weeks all of the stalls were successful raising over \$1200, working as a team and not giving up. The students were in groups of four using cardboard, glue, tape and many other items needed to create their amazing stalls. "It was a day my group and I will not forget. My group members were David, Jack, Hugo and myself. Our stall was very popular throughout the day. # **Kevin Knapp - CEO ERCKWA**


