

Marylin wasn't just an amazing supporter of the organisation, she was our friend. She was a strong woman who will be sadly missed.

The protocols mean that all ERCWA staff and volunteers have been trained and assessed, and diligently comply with a comprehensive set of policies and protocols.


In turn, this ensures that all who access our services can do so with the confidence and safety they deserve.

The Late Teens' camp theme was video games.
